**Bio** Loch Willy is the Manager of Northern Business Development within the Corporate Social Responsibility department at AREVA Resources Canada. AREVA Resources is part of the French AREVA Group, and is a world leader in uranium mining with major operations in Northern Saskatchewan and exploration activities in Nunavut and Quebec.

Prior to joining AREVA Resources Loch worked with Northern and Aboriginal groups in the Airline, Diamond, Oil and Gas and Uranium industries. Loch has over 10 years of experience assisting stakeholders establish sustainable economic developments, partnerships and lasting employment opportunities. His commitment to sustainable development and corporate social responsibility is further applied to his role at AREVA to maximize Northern inclusion in the procurement process by identifying opportunities and encouraging Northern entrepreneurs' involvement in the uranium mining industry.

**Presentation** An Introduction to Corporate Social Responsibility at AREVA

With headquarters in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, AREVA Resources Canada Inc. is one of the world's largest producers of uranium operating mining and milling facilities in northern Saskatchewan. AREVA Resources operates and holds a 70% interest in the expanding McClean Lake mine and mill operation and a 69% interest in the proposed Midwest mine project. AREVA Resources is currently decommissioning the Cluff Lake uranium mine and exploring for uranium mainly in Saskatchewan and Quebec, while also studying the viability of a new uranium mine and mill in Nunavut.

Over half of the workers at AREVA Resources' Cluff Lake and McClean Lake sites are residents of northern Saskatchewan. Loch Willy's presentation will provide an overview of AREVA Resources' sustainable development values and corporate social responsibility activities and the role the company plays in Saskatchewan's North. By outlining AREVA's definition of corporate social responsibility, he will deliver some insight in the company's efforts and focus in this field within the current economic climate.
